Port Moody

Temporary Closure of Seaview Drive on the East Side of Clarke Road

Subsurface ground improvements at Clarke Road and Seaview Drive are ongoing. Starting the week of **February 15**, crews will be shifting the jet grouting operations to the east side of Clarke Road at Seaview Drive and access to Seaview Drive on the east side of Clarke Road will be temporarily closed.

Crews are continuing to strengthen the soil in this area in advance of the arrival of the tunnel boring machine (TBM). The TBM will arrive under Clarke Road at Seaview Drive in March. When it arrives, crews will need to inspect and change the cutterhead tools and undertake regular maintenance before the TBM advances.

Lane closures on Clarke Road between Mount Royal Drive and Ingersoll Avenue will remain in effect. In addition, access to and from Seaview Drive on the west side of Clarke Road will remain closed. More detailed information regarding the traffic pattern changes related to this work are outlined on page two.

WHAT TO EXPECT

Ongoing Construction Activity

- The subsurface ground improvement work will be ongoing for approximately one more month. Crews are continuing to inject cement grout (jet grouting) into the ground approximately 40 metres below the surface.
- Hours of work will be 8 a.m. to 10 p.m. Monday through Saturday and 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Sunday (if required). Every effort is being made to complete work by 8 p.m., however, in some instances work may extend until 10 p.m.
- Safety fencing will remain around the work area while this work is underway.
- During jet grouting operations, nearby residents can expect noise related to drilling, air compression, cement pumps, hydro-vacuuming, generators and the use of heavy machinery.
- When crews are working at night, construction lighting will be used and efforts will be made to angle the lighting away from nearby residents. Construction lighting will only be used during working hours.
- Every effort will be made to complete this work as soon as possible and to minimize noise and disruption.
- Access to residents' homes will be maintained.

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Traffic Pattern Changes

Clarke Road

- Lane closures on Clarke Road at Seaview Drive will be in effect until April. One lane in each direction will be maintained at all times. During the weekday morning peak period (6 a.m. to 9 a.m.), a second southbound lane will be provided.

Seaview Drive (West)

- The west connection of Seaview Drive to Clarke Road will remain closed until further notice. Local residents wishing to access Clarke Road from Seaview Drive on the west side will be detoured to Glenayre Drive.

Seaview Drive (East)

- The east connection of Seaview Drive to Clarke Road will be closed for approximately one month starting the week of February 15. Local residents wishing to access Clarke Road from Seaview Drive on the east side will be detoured to Seaforth Way.
- In order to ensure the safety of drivers using Seaforth Way to access Clarke Road, the following will be implemented:
 - The speed limit on Clarke Road at Seaforth Way will be reduced from 50 km/h to 40 km/h when the closure is in place.
 - Digital speed warning boards will be installed to warn drivers if they are travelling too fast.
 - Traffic and queues will be monitored for the first few days to determine if further measures are required.
 - Additional enforcement will be in effect during the detour period.

Traffic control personnel will be on-site at Clarke Road and Seaview Drive during working hours to assist drivers. When lane closures are in effect, drivers, cyclists and pedestrians are asked to watch for construction and detour signs, proceed with caution and follow the directions of traffic control personnel.
