Cecile Drive – Road Restoration Update

Geotechnical investigations on Cecile Drive over the tunnel alignment are ongoing and the dewatering wells have been removed. Crews have begun restoration work, which will occur in two phases. After the first phase the road will open in a temporary condition, until final roadworks can be completed in the second phase. We will provide an update on timing for each phase in the next week or two.

WHAT TO EXPECT – PHASE I

- Crews will begin the restoration of Cecile Drive starting on March 4 so that both lanes can be made available to traffic as soon as possible. The road surface of the south lane will remain in a temporary condition until final roadworks can be completed in Phase II.
- Noise related to construction activities will include drilling, concrete trucks, material hauling and the use of heavy machinery and will be in effect from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday through Friday and on Saturdays from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Crews will work on Sundays only if required.
- Single lane alternating traffic on Cecile Drive, just west of Highview Place, will remain in effect.
- Traffic control personnel will continue to be on site to assist drivers. Drivers, cyclists and pedestrians are asked to watch for construction signs, proceed with caution and follow the directions of traffic control personnel.
- There will be no change to the location of bus stops while this work is underway.
- The temporary parking restrictions on the south side of Cecile Drive will remain in effect until Cecile Drive is fully re-opened.

FINAL CECILE DRIVE ROAD RESTORATION – PHASE II

- Final roadworks for Cecile Drive will take approximately one week to complete and will take place later this spring. Crews will lay new asphalt on the entire section of roadway, including new lane markings.
- Paving requires warm, dry weather conditions, so this work is weather dependent.
- Nearby residents will be updated on the final roadworks closer to the start date.
