Clarke Road Closure at Seaview Drive Traffic Pattern Changes and Detour Route

Clarke Road at Seaview Drive will be temporarily closed to traffic as part of ongoing maintenance to the tunnel boring machine (TBM). Clarke Road is closed to traffic in both directions at Seaview Drive in Port Moody until further notice. Traffic signage and traffic detours have been activated. A map outlining the detour routes is on page two.

The tunnel boring machine (TBM) is currently under Clarke Road at Seaview Drive as part of planned regular maintenance to inspect and replace the cutterhead tools before the TBM advances. While completing maintenance under Clarke Road at Seaview Drive, despite our ground improvement program, some additional ground material entered the TBM chamber and an air pocket developed. The air pocket resulted in a hole in the asphalt on Clarke Road. Safety is the first priority on the Evergreen Line Project and crews are addressing the situation within a secure fenced area.

Please follow the directions of all traffic control personnel. An update on when Clarke Road will re-open to traffic in both directions will be posted to the project website www.evergreenline.gov.bc.ca when more information is available.

SAFETY

- **While the full closure is in effect, drivers are reminded that they are travelling through residential areas and must follow posted speed limits.**
 - The posted speed limit on Glenayre Drive is 50 kilometres per hour.
 - The posted speed limit on Cecile Drive and Angela Drive is 30 kilometres per hour.
 - The posted speed limit on Mount Royal Drive will be reduced to 30 kilometres per hour.
- Digital speed warning boards have been installed throughout the detour routes to warn drivers if they are travelling too fast and there will be additional police enforcement while the temporary detours are in effect.
- Traffic control personnel will be positioned throughout the detour routes to assist pedestrians and local traffic. Additionally they will be monitoring the detour routes to maximize traffic flow as necessary.
- The speed limit in the work zone on Clarke Road near Seaview Drive will continue to be 40 kilometres per hour while work is underway.
- Traffic control personnel will be at the following intersections:
 - Clarke Road and Cecile Drive
 - Cecile Drive and Angela Drive
 - Angela Drive and Glenayre Drive
 - Mount Royal Drive and Glenayre Drive
 - Ailsa Avenue and Glenayre Drive during peak periods 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.
 - Glencoe Drive and Glenayre Drive crosswalk during school hours 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.



TRAFFIC PATTERN CHANGES

Clarke Road

- Drivers travelling northbound will be temporarily detoured at Glenayre Drive to Mount Royal Avenue to access Clarke Road.
- Southbound traffic on Clarke Road will be temporarily detoured at Cecile Drive to Angela Drive and Glenayre Drive.
- Drivers are advised to follow detour signage, reduce speed and follow the directions of all traffic control personnel.
- Drivers will experience delays while this work is underway and should consider alternate routes while this detour is in effect.
- We will provide an update when we have more information about re-opening Clarke Road. The most up-to-date information will be posted to the project website www.evergreenline.gov.bc.ca



When the TBM maintenance is complete and the work site has been removed, the roadway at Clarke Road and Seaview Drive will be restored. Your continued patience and understanding is appreciated.
